Ranchi

The year 2021 began with slight restrictions due to pandemic and life trying to come back to normalcy. Again an upsurge in the cases of Covid by March. In between this ups and downs we had four ABC and ARV camps in Hazaribagh and Ramgarh about 100 and 50 kms away from Ranchi during the year. There was growing volunteer support not only in Ranchi but also from out station and we are taking more steps for increasing it further. Our supporters had





donated generously for the community dogs undergoing treatment at our centre. Ranchi Municipal Corporation has done some fabrication and renovation work of the centre.

Dr. Ajoy is a pillar of the Ranchi Project. He has been with us since 14 years, has gained immense experience over the years dealing with various complicated rescue cases and conducting ABC surgery.

Dog Catching and Surgery

Dog Catching is the initial procedure in the work of Animal Birth Control Programme (ABC). The catchers pick up the dogs from different wards of Ranchi and then the process begins which ends with the sterilisation and release of the dogs back to their area from where they were picked.

We got our team vaccinated against Covid 19 at the Vidhan Sabha centre for vaccination as they were the frontline workers who were in direct contact with the people while catching the community dogs for sterilisation. Since the schools were closed the education campaigns in schools could not be conducted. We got special permission to carry on awareness campaign in "J K International School", Agru, Ratu Ranchi on "World Rabies Day"- 28th September 2021.

WORLD RABIES DAY- "Facts not Fears"



Our Team members Mr. Nandan Sharma and Mr. Chottu Lohara visited J K International School, Agru, Ratu and organised a workshop on World Rabies Day. They made the students of the school

aware about the Rabies and its prevention. They distributed pamphlets on rabies amongst the students. They informed them how the Animal Birth Control and Anti Rabies Vaccination programmes are carried out, which over a span of 12





years has helped in keeping the city of Ranchi rabies free since 2017.

We got good response from the students who asked question regarding how the disease spreads and what are the ways of its prevention. The questions were answered well by our team members Mr. Nandan Sharma and Dr. Jigisha Srivastava.

Cases of Rescues, Treatment and Release

We had provided treatment to **54 IPD cases** (case no 85 to 139) of rescues in 2021 apart from that field treatments and OPD cases have also been done both of **Ranchi** and **Out-station**.

1. Field treatment



This is the case of field treatment from Patel Nagar, Birsa Chowk, about a community dog had got his head stuck in a plastic container.

We rescued and freed him.





Case 109 from Ratu Road Inderpuri, a female dog with wound full of maggots and was big. She was with us for about 25 days. With proper food, care and medicines she recovered. On full recovery she







was released back to her area under the care of the volunteer.

2. Treatment cases at our centre—Case 107

One of the person called and informed us that a dog was stuck in the heap of coal tar. A thick layer of coal tar was clinging on the skin of the dog. Due to which he was in immense pain. On receiving the call our team reached and rescued the dog. The dog was brought to the centre and our vet cleaned the skin and removed the thick layer with the betadine solution. Apart from this there were some wounds too on fore limb and was also suffering from mange. Antibiotics, painkillers and others medicines for skin dis-







ease were given. Dressing of the wound was done on regular basis. With proper care, medicines and food the condition



improved. On full recovery was released back to the area. Such kind of irresponsible act of humans lead to such big problems for these voiceless angels of the street. Had the coal tar not been left on the street pilled up after use the dog would not have been stuck in it.

Thus it is the duty of we humans to take care that such unused construction waste should not be left on the street which could harm community animals.

Case 89

Our catchers found a female dog during catching who was roaming near samlong, Chutia with a pencil and a screw driver injected in her vaginal region. She was in immense pain. They caught her and brought to our clinic. Our vet Dr. Ajoy after observation removed the pencil and screw driver which was injected in her vaginal region by surgery. She was relieved from immense pain. With proper care, food





and medication she is recovering. It is such a pity that some people indulge in such deliberate acts of cruelty that shames humanity.

Ramgarh- OPD case

A community dog who was fed and looked after by our supporter Mrs. Kavitha Sri Kumar, the First Lady of the Sikh Regimental Centre, Ramgarh was brought for treatment at our centre in Ranchi. The female community dog was suffering from uterine prolapse. She was in immense pain. Our vet, Dr. Ajoy examined and treated her and prescribed medicines. She was taken back to Ramgarh after treatment. What society needs today are people like her who took all efforts to get the community dog treated by sending her to Ranchi 50 Kms away from Ramgarh and taking her back. **We salute her for care, compassion and love for community dogs. Later the dog was adopted by a loving family**













Hazaribagh Chapter—ABC and ARV Camp

A meeting was organized by Hope and Animal Trust, Ranchi working in different parts of country, (Varanasi, Aurangabad (Maharashtra), Ratnagiri, Patiala and Rishikesh) since last 15 years at Hazaribagh. It was an extended Hazaribagh group which participated actively in the meeting. In meeting, apart from Dr. Jigisha of Hope and Animal Trust, Ranchi, members of Hazaribagh group imminent per-





sonalities like Mr. Mohammad Khalid, Sri Dinesh Khandelwal, Dr Satyaprakash, Mr. Deo Pratap Singh, Mr. Ujjawal Pratap Singh, Mr. Suraj Kumar, Mr. Shivsankar Goswami, Mr. Kushal, some serving officials, some retired officers like Mahendra Prasad (IFS) participated. Happily we could arrange about 30 dogs to be sterilized and sufficient funds had been assured /arranged for camp in Hazaribagh in very recent future. Mr. Deo Pratap Singh assured and assigned to request vetenary officals for providing space in their campus for organizing camp. Mr. Dinesh

Khandelwalji assured and assigned to fix an appointment with Mrs Madhwi Mishra, Nagar Aayukt for further discussion for their involvement in working for community dogs. Meeting ended on very positive and happy thanksgiving to all enthusiastic participants.

A successful **Animal Birth Control (ABC) Camp** was organised on 31st January 2021 in Forest Colony, Hazaribagh with the support of the local volunteers. We sterilised 30 dogs (female 18 and male 12) in the camp. We are thankful to the RCCF Hazaribagh for giving us the premises for the sterilisation operation.





Ramgarh Chapter and ABC and ARV camps

The **first and second** Animal Birth Control (ABC) and Anti Rabies Vaccination (ARV) Camps were organised on 21 st and 24 th February 2021 at Sikh Regimental Centre (SRC) Ramgarh on the initiative of Centre Commandant Brigadier M Sri Kumar and Mrs Kumar. We sterilised 41 community dogs (female 24 and male 17) of the Sikh Regimental Centre (SRC) and Punjab Regimental Centre (PRC) in the two camps. We appreciate the efforts taken by Centre Commandant and the First Lady in taking such a positive step to curtail the population of the community dogs of the Cantonment in the most humane way.













The **third** Animal Birth Control (ABC) and Anti Rabies Vaccination (ARV) Camp on 26th June at Sikh Regimental Centre (SRC) Ramgarh approx 50 kms from Ranchi on the initiative of Centre Commandant Brigadier M Sri Kumar and the First Lady Mrs Kavitha Sri Kumar. We sterilised 29 community dogs (females 15 and males 14) of the Sikh Regimental Centre (SRC). Thus in all the three camps held so far total 70 community dogs have been sterilised.

Community Support

Registration of pet dogs is essential with municipality and it is done by us. A number of canine parents have got there pet dogs registered this year. Some of them are as follows.



Cov id Era dog food distribut ion done at Varanas i-2021

With the coming of second wave of Covid 19 the entire country was spell bound. Every thing went berserk with explosion in the number of cases which no one could have ever anticipated. At this juncture no one could have ever thought off how difficult life of the lesser mortals (community dogs) could have been. To break the chain government imposed restrictions which was nothing but locked down. As the restaurants, food stalls etc were closed and only essential services were continuing for people. Due to this the furry angels of the street are not having access to the left over food. They are desperately searching for food in this troubled times. Thus with the support of our donor Help Animals India we bought over 200 bags of Dog Food worth INR 3,00,000 to be feed to community dogs in entire Varanasi with the help of volunteers and staff. This will be continued for next 3 weeks with feeding target of over 1000 dogs every day to reach out to over 10,000 dogs alternatively during this drive.

Guardians of All Voiceless Animals —Rishikesh



Just like Patiala, the Rishikesh project is run under the name of Guardians of All Voiceless Animals it is also supported by Guardians of All Voiceless, USA. GAVA Rishikesh has been engaged in rescue, treatment and release of distressed animals across the city and its suburbs. Besides this, we have also been involved in adoption and a very small scale sterilization programme of community

animals. Having a small team we always try to restrict our workload but since we have been active in the field from a long time now, we receive approx 10-50 calls on any given day, not to mention the on-site follow-ups; attending such heavy number of calls would have never been possible because the kind inhabitants of the city.

We have successfully provided treatment to over 550 animals with maggot wounds, accidental injuries, mammary tumours, TVT, Foot and mouth disease, some communicable diseases like distemper and parvovirus. Street feeding drive: Just like other projects in Rishikesh too we began a feeding drive in lockdown from March, 2020 which was later extended and the team continued the feeding community dogs covering over 40 dogs every day.











ADOPTIONS-

In comparison to our other chapters apart from Aurangabad the adoptions in Rishikesh are certainly higher, the numbers are a proof as in year 2021 we got total 40 animals adopted.































Aurangabad for Animals—Aurangabad & Shirdi

After our work with Municipal Corporation of Aurangabad got over, we started working using our new-ly constructed Shelter. In 2021 We have rescued and treated over 1000 animals, including over 50 serious surgeries. We ran ABC program for cats and dogs and also set up Mobile ABC and Treatment camps in the rural areas.

We have done adoption of over 200 stray cats/dogs trough our adoption portal. In Aurangabad city, 110+ volunteers fed 2000+ stray animals every day during the Lockdown and continued to feed after the Lock down.

Participation of volunteers is vital for any non profit work. We are thankful towards all our volunteers and we are thankful towards all the donors who gives us resources to do the work we are doing.

This summer we installed 300+ water jars in the city of Aurangabad, Maharashtra. Our team is working towards installing as many water jars as possible.



Spaying and neutering













We have a fully equipped Operation theatre and fostering facility, where our expert doctors and staff perform neutering operations.

Spaying/Neutering is an important aspect of animal welfare and Animal Population Control (APC). APC supports to end suffering of mother canine/cat and also the suffering of those puppies kittens who die with hunger or negligence.



Cat Facility





Like Cats, we have developed facility for the Dogs as well, all the injured, accidental dogs are brought and treated at the Shelter. We don't house them permanently, however, most of these dogs are going back to their original location after complete recovery, they all are spayed/ neuter and vaccinated before release. This is again first of it's kind facility in Aurangabad City.
